Held at the esteemed Ajou University, the seminar commenced at 11:00 a.m. The symposium commenced with a heartfelt opening prayer, eloquently led by Sylvester Dadzie, and a brief welcome remarks by Richard Kabutey, the President of GHASKA. An address on behalf of Her Excellency Mrs. Charis Obetsebi-Lamptey Zwennes, the Ambassador was delivered by Ms. Rita Kissi, head of chancer. VALUES AND LEADERSHIP SEMINAR

This realization prompts us to ponder some critical questions: What lies ahead for Ghanaian societies in light of the prevailing moral decay? How can we reclaim our moral integrity in the face of these challenges? These questions and more compelled the current GHASKA Executives to organize a Values and Leadership program, an endeavor aimed at reconnecting with our cherished values and raising transformational leaders who would be instrumental in bringing about the much-needed change in the country.

The program, titled "Building the Nation through Values," was conducted via Zoom on Saturday, April 29, 2023, at 7:30 KST (10:30 am GMT). The distinguished Guest Speaker for the event was Mr. James Ebo White, renowned as Uncle Ebo White, an accomplished playwright, author, and motivational speaker with a significant presence in Ghana's radio and television landscape. He also serves as the CEO of Roverman Productions.

The program unfolded as scheduled, commencing at 7:30 pm, with a heartfelt opening prayer led by Ms. Kekeli Amegayie, a student of Seoul National University. Mr. Richard Kabutey, GHASKA's President, and Divine Kporxah, the Vice President, adeptly moderated the event, ensuring its smooth progression. The program had 72 attendees, including students, alumni, invited guests, and GHASKA patrons.

In the absence of the Ghana Ambassador to Korea, Ms. Rita Kissi, the Head of Chancery at the Ghana Embassy in Korea, delivered a gracious speech expressing her appreciation to the GHASKA Executives for their outstanding program. She urged all participants to actively engage and embrace the values crucial for nation-building.

During his presentation, the Guest Speaker, Mr. James Ebo White, outlined eight reasons contributing to the prevalence of corruption and immoral values in our society. He emphasized:


- 1. Celebration of wealth without scrutiny
- 2. The creation of a system that devalues those without financial resources
- 3. Protection of wrongdoers in Ghana
- 4. Excessive deference to foreigners within Ghana

- 5. Loss of hope in Ghana's potential for transformation
- 6. The hollowness of religion in Ghana
- 7. Failure to modernize our culture into the 21st century
- 8. Excessive rhetoric without corresponding actions.

To chart a path forward for Ghana, Mr. White proposed four key points:

- 1. Belief in Ghana's capacity for change
- 2. Recognition that Ghana's transformation depends on individuals acting as the critical mass
- 3. A call to embody the difference we wish to see
- 4. A shift away from excessive reliance on politicians for Ghana's change.

Following Mr. White's compelling presentation, attendees engaged in valuable discussions, shared remarks, and posed thoughtful questions. The Guest Speaker commended the synergy between the student body and alumni, expressing his desire to become an Associate Member of GHASKA and offering his expertise for potential future events.





GHASKA MEMBERSHIP DATABASE


Members added to the GHASKA Databse during the 2022/23 administration = 28 (8.4% Increase)

1. Gender




2. Classification

Students = 23; Associate{ graduates residing in Korea) = 2; Short-Term training = 1 Trianing Course = 1 and Visiting Researchers = 1




3. Degree Type
