Her expertise provided members with the tools necessary to enhance their job applications and increase their competitiveness.

Dr. Dukes Anim, a professor at *Yemyeong Graduate University* and an alumnus of GHASKA, shared valuable strategies on building qualifications to secure visas for staying and working in Korea after graduation. His guidance highlighted critical points for members to consider as they plan their careers in Korea.

The seminar successfully fostered knowledge sharing and networking, reinforcing *GHASKA's* commitment to supporting members in their professional development and job search efforts.



INDEPENDENCE DAY CELEBRATION The Role of Ghanaian Students in the in the Diaspora in National Development

On March 6, 2024, NUGS-China in collaboration with GHASKA, GHASAM (Ghanaian Students in Morocco), GHASAI (Ghanaian Students in India) and NUGS-RUSSIA organized a round table discussion dubbed "The Role of Ghanaians Students in the Diaspora in National Development" via zoom to commemorate the 67th Independence Anniversary.

In attendance was *Prof. Yayra Dzakadzi*, the *Director of Tertiary Education, Ministry* of Education and Deputy Director-General of the Ghana Tertiary Education Commission (GTEC). The even witnessed discussants from the various sister institutions giving insight into how members can contribute to the development of Ghana.

This event was successful in making members realize that their role in nation-building is pivotal and they could leverage their exposure to advanced technologies and international education to drive progress back home.



GHASKA Town Hall Meeting Report

On *April 6, 2024, GHASKA* hosted a Town Hall meeting at the *Seoul National University Asia Center* in a hybrid format, enabling both in-person and online participation. The primary goal was to create a platform for dialogue between students and the Embassy, addressing various concerns. This initiative was made possible through the collaboration of the *GHASKA executive team and the SNU-Asia Center*.

GHASKA Executive team and *SNU-Asia* Center representative Joonhwa Cho welcomed attendees, emphasizing the vital role *GHASKA* plays in strengthening *Ghana-South Korea relations*.

Discussions included potential collaborations, such as exchange programs for Ghanaian professors to visit *Seoul National University* and vice versa.

Key issues addressed during the meeting included the authentication of academic documents, personal effect waivers for students at Ghana Port, costs associated with TCs and passports, scholarships, and various importation challenges. Both parties expressed satisfaction with the discussions, and the embassy reaffirmed its ongoing support for Ghanaian students.

Dr. Duke Ofosu-Anim provided valuable insights on living in Korea and immigration opportunities, highlighting the importance of cultural integration. *Pastor Thompson Eduful, GHASKA patron*, encouraged members to practice patience and maintain faith in their endeavors.

The meeting concluded with the signing of two cooperation agreements: one with Study Korea News to provide members with up-to-date information on living, working, and opportunities for students in Korea, and another with the Foreigners in Korea Support Center to offer support on immigration and related matters. *GHASKA Vice President Mr. Patrick Danour* delivered closing remarks, reinforcing the commitment of GHASKA and the Ghanaian embassy to support *Ghanaian students* and enhance bilateral relations.




Financial Literacy and Mindset Change Seminar

Regional Meetings Overview

Daegu Region

On *March 1st, 2024, DGIST GHASKA* successfully hosted a regional event for the Daegu region, sponsored by *DGIST GHASKA* members and supported by contributions from participants from various institutions. The gathering aimed to foster community spirit and facilitate the transition for newcomers.

Approximately 20 participants attended, including around a quarter of new students or individuals attending a *GHASKA meeting* for the first time. The attendees represented a diverse group from *DGIST*, *Yeungnam University*, *KNU*, as well as several graduates and associates from other institutions.

Activities were thoughtfully designed to promote interaction and camaraderie. Participants engaged in outdoor sports such as soccer, which encouraged friendly competition, as well as a variety of indoor games for more relaxed socializing. The event concluded with a *traditional Ghanaian meal*, serving as both a cultural highlight and an opportunity for participants to bond over shared experiences.

The event was a resounding success, effectively welcoming new students into the *GHASKA community* while strengthening connections among returning members. The combination of sports, games, and shared meals fostered a sense of belonging and unity among all participants.

Africa Cultural Festival - 2024

GHASKA Annual Sports Festival - July 13, 2024.

The annual GHASKA sports event was held on July 13, 2024, at Hanbat National University, attracting approximately 195 attendees the highest in the history of GHASKA, including participants from over 15 different countries. The event was wellorganized and honored by the presence of several dignitaries, including *H.E. Mrs. Charis Obetsebi-Lamptey Zweness, Ghana's Ambassador to South Korea*; Professor Jung Ho Park from Hanbat National University; Deputy Ambassador Mr. Adomako; Ms. Hyeonjeong from UNESCO; and Pastor Kim Kijoong of the HH Community.

Ambassador Zweness delivered the opening remarks, emphasizing the significance of festivals in helping students destress, fostering teamwork and cooperation, and promoting healthy minds and bodies.

The event featured a series of track and field competitions as well as a soccer tournament, with teams identified by colors: *Seoul (Red), Suwon (Yellow), Daejeon (Green/White), and Busan-Daegu (Black). Daejeon* excelled in the track events, while the soccer tournament concluded with *Daejeon* taking first place, followed by *Seoul, Daegu-Busan*, and *Suwon*.

The event culminated in an awards ceremony, recognizing participants and awarding medals to the best regions in each activity. Alumni presentations, facilitated by *Dr. Reynolds Addo-Akoto and Dr. Kwadwo Boateng*, highlighted their various research areas.

The conference also featured a panel discussion titled "*Developing a Global Mindset*," with insights from Dr. Kwadwo Boateng, Mr. Sam Okyere, and Dr. Evans Okpoti, who examined the complexities of navigating a rapidly globalizing society. Ms. Bia Lee, from the Foreigners in Korea Support Center, provided valuable guidance on visa navigation.

The event concluded with a brainstorming session that addressed policy-making and cultural adaptability. Awards were distributed to participants, sponsors were acknowledged, this conference marked another successful endeavor for GHASKA, reinforcing its commitment to innovation and collaboration. Constitutional Review




GHASKA MEMBERSHIP STATISTICS
